Lee Grew up and completed his education in Newark, New Jersey. He graduated from Pace and Rutgers Universities.

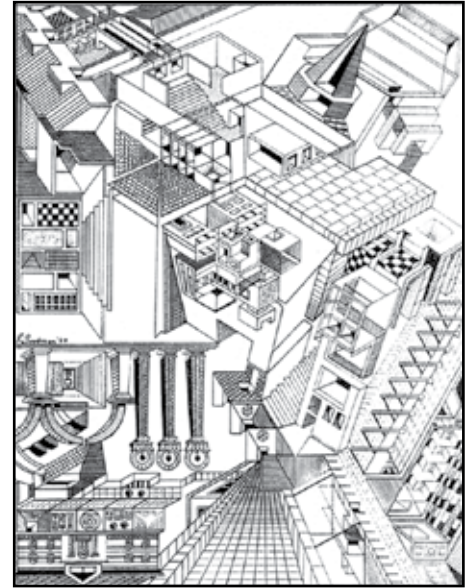
It was during his retirement, within the last ten years, that he started to doodle and begin a whole new chapter in his life with his unique architectural abstract art.
